1.INTRODUCTION

Operating across the diverse agro-climatic zones of Uttarakhand, HortiFed leverages a robust network of grassroots cooperatives and stakeholders to provide end-to-end support to the horticulture sector. Its key areas of intervention include technical training, sustainable production techniques, post-harvest management, collective marketing, value addition, and supply chain optimization. By strengthening these elements, the federation aims to enhance productivity, reduce post-harvest losses, and improve the market competitiveness of high-quality horticultural produce grown in the state.

Driven by its mission to empower rural communities and improve farm incomes, HortiFed promotes inclusive growth by focusing not only on commercial horticulture ventures but also on supporting small and marginal farmers. Special emphasis is placed on introducing environmentally sustainable practices, promoting collective farming models, and facilitating access to new technologies and markets.

HortiFed maintains strategic partnerships with government agencies, research institutions, and private enterprises to provide its members with access to best-in-class knowledge, innovations, and financial linkages. 2. SCOPE OF WORK

Uttarakhand Horticulture Cooperative Federation Ltd. (HortiFed), an apex-level cooperative federation under the Government of Uttarakhand, is actively engaged in various horticultural and allied sector initiatives aimed at improving livelihoods, enhancing agricultural productivity, and promoting sustainable farming practices across the state. To support and strengthen its ongoing and future initiatives, HortiFed seeks to empanel technically sound and experienced agencies/firms/Companies for providing **technical support and handholding services**.

The selected agencies will be expected to assist in the following core and allied areas of horticulture and cooperative development:

2.1 Cooperative and Collective Farming Support

- Technical assistance in planning and executing collective farming models in horticulture across multiple districts of Uttarakhand.
- Mobilization of farmers for participation in cooperative farming practices by utilizing their land on a shared basis.
- Designing and implementing sustainable crop planning and integrated farm models, considering local agro-climatic conditions.
- Supporting in adoption of good agricultural practices (GAP), high-density plantation, and improved input management.

2.2 Apple Orchard Development

- Providing technical expertise for the establishment and management of apple orchards, including site selection, variety selection, nursery development, orchard layout, and plantation.
- Capacity building of farmers and cooperative members in orchard management techniques including pruning, training, pest management, and irrigation.
- Facilitating post-harvest management, cold storage solutions, and grading and packaging practices.

2.3 Mushroom Cultivation

- Technical handholding for setting up mushroom cultivation units, including spawn production, growing structures (rooms/sheds), and composting.
- Training programs and practical demonstrations on different types of mushrooms such as button, oyster, and milky mushrooms.

2.4 Floriculture Development

2.5Polyhouse and Protected Cultivation

- Assistance in design, installation, and operation of polyhouses, net houses, and greenhouses for high-value crops including vegetables, flowers, and exotic plants.
- Promoting adoption of protected cultivation to enable year-round production and quality improvement.
- Training on crop selection, fertigation systems, pest and disease management in controlled environments.

2.6Beekeeping and Apiculture

- Promoting apiculture as an income-generating activity and for enhancing pollination in orchards and vegetable farms.
- Establishing bee colonies and training cooperative members on scientific bee management, honey extraction, and processing techniques.
- Facilitating linkages for the sale of honey and other bee products.

2.7. Development of Point-of-Sale (POS) and Market Linkages

- Supporting HortiFed in setting up and managing Point-of-Sale (POS) outlets for the marketing and sale of horticultural produce such as apples, mushrooms, honey, vegetables, processed products, etc.
- Assisting in branding, packaging, and promotion of cooperative-grown produce under a common label or identity.
- Facilitating market research, demand forecasting, and buyer-seller meets for enhanced price realization.

2.8. Technical Capacity Building & Farmer Training

- Designing and conducting structured training modules and handholding programs for farmers and cooperative members on modern horticulture practices.
- On-ground support through field visits, demonstrations, workshops, and exposure visits.
- Building institutional capacities at the cooperative level for operations, record-keeping, quality assurance, and compliance.

2.9. Enterprise and Value Chain Development

- Identifying viable horticulture-based micro-enterprises and supporting their incubation and scale-up.
- Facilitating linkages with financial institutions for credit, subsidies, and government schemes relevant to horticulture and allied activities.
- Support in setting up small-scale value addition units (e.g., juice extraction, drying, grading, packaging, etc.).

2.10. Monitoring, Reporting, and Impact Evaluation

- Regular monitoring and documentation of field-level activities, outcomes, and best practices.
- Preparing progress reports, case studies, success stories, and data-driven impact assessments to inform future strategies.
- Supporting digital record maintenance and MIS (Management Information System) development for cooperative operations.

2.11 Innovation and Technology Introduction

5. General Terms and Conditions

- 5.1 The empanelment letter shall not confer any right to engagement. - 5.2 Empanelment Duration: The empanelment will be for a period of three (03) years, subject to annual renewal, depending on the performance of the agency and their compliance of terms and conditions at the sole discretion of HortiFed.
- 5.3HortiFed reserves the right to i. reject any / all proposals without assigning any reasons thereof, ii. relax or waive any of the conditions stipulated in this EOI document as deemed necessary in the best interest of HortiFed and the objectives of the project without assigning any reasons thereof and iii. include any other item(s) in the Scope of work at any time after consultation.
- 5.4Blacklisting/debarring: HortiFed reserves the right to cancel the empanelment letter issued and debar the firm if it is discovered that the firm had produced any false information, on continued delivery of unsatisfactory services, insolvency of the company or any other ethical ground as deemed fit by giving a 7-day prior written notice.
- 5.5 Subcontracting: There must be no further subcontracting without prior written consent of HortiFed; all manpower deployed by the Service provider shall be on-roll employees of the Service provider or must have a direct employment contract with the Service provider.
- 5.6 Allocation of work post empanelment: The allocation of work post empanelment among all the empaneled agencies will be made by floating quotation enquiries through nomination basis as and when the requirements arise.
- 5.7 Presentation: As a part of Evaluation of proposals submitted by the applicants, HortiFed reserves the right to seek further information or a presentation from the Organizations for evaluation purpose.
- 5.8 Amendment to EOI: At any time prior to the last date for receipt of applications, HortiFed may for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective applicant, modify the EOI document by an amendment. In order to provide prospective applicants reasonable time in which to take the amendment into account in preparing their proposals, HortiFed may at its discretion extend the last date for the receipt of proposals and/or make other changes in the requirements set out in the EOI.  - Submitted a proposal that is not accompanied by required documentation or is nonresponsive, failed to provide clarifications related thereto, when sought v. Submitted more than one proposal
 - Was declared ineligible by the Government of India/State/UT Government for corrupt and fraudulent practices.

 - Not properly sealed and signed as per requirements.
 - Received after the expiry of due date and time. iv. Missing of any supporting document(s) with the Proposal.
